GRANT APPLICATION PROCEDURES

The AALAS Foundation Board of Directors (AFBOD) reviews proposals at its spring and fall meetings. Proposals should be submitted by April 1 for review at the summer meeting; and by September 1 for review at the fall meeting. Funding for proposals approved at the spring meeting is available during July of that year. Funding for proposals approved at the fall meeting is available during January of the next calendar year.

Mail eighteen copies of the completed Grant Request Form and proposal to the AALAS Foundation, 9190 Crestwyn Hills Drive, Memphis, TN 38125. Upon receipt of the Proposal, the notice of receipt and date of review will be communicated to the specified contact person.

To request an exception to the scheduled review date, submit an explanation of the reasons to the AFBOD Chair. Exceptions will be made only when the proposal is considered of extreme importance to the AALAS Foundation mission.

I. PROPOSAL FORMAT

Each proposal must contain the following nine SPECIFIC SECTIONS and requested information. The total proposal must not exceed 8 pages.

1. **AALAS Foundation Grant Request Form – signed.** (from <http://foundation.aalas.org> or call the AALAS National office. Counts as 1 page.)
2. **Title.** A working Project Title for the proposal.
3. **Objectives for the project.** The Foundation is particularly interested in how the proposed program will promote the awareness of research animal care and animal contributions to biomedical research, safety testing and education, or will enhance professional development within the laboratory animal care and use community.
4. **Description of the proposed project.**
5. **Method for evaluating the success of the completed project.**
6. **Time line of events.** The time should include important dates and milestones.
7. **Detailed budget.** Include an itemized and total requested budget. The Foundation **does not** provide funding for administrative overhead, indirect costs or travel to scientific meetings.
8. **Additional resources.** Explain other required resources necessary for completion of this project, including additional funding and sources.
9. **Names and addresses of individuals and organizations involved in the project.** Include resume or curriculum vitae (not part of 8 -page limit).

II. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION (if applicable)

1. **IACUC approval.** If the proposal involves animal use, pre-approval is needed from the Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee.
2. **Supporting documentation.** Additional supporting materials may be provided as appendix attachments to all copies of the proposal.

III. CRITERIA FOR REVIEW OF PROPOSALS

The AFBOD will evaluate each proposal using the following criteria:

1. The proposal has a clear purpose.
2. The objectives of the proposal are consistent with the **Mission Statement** of the AALAS Foundation.
3. The description, timetable and plan of implementation are clear and concise.
4. The individuals involved have the experience and knowledge to complete the project as outlined.
5. The budget is realistic and reasonable.
6. Facilities, staffing and resources necessary for completion of project are adequate.
7. The project can be completed within the timeframe outlined in the proposal.
8. A method of evaluation of the success of the completed project has been defined.



GRANT APPLICATION PROCEDURES (cont.)

IV. CONDITIONS OF AWARD

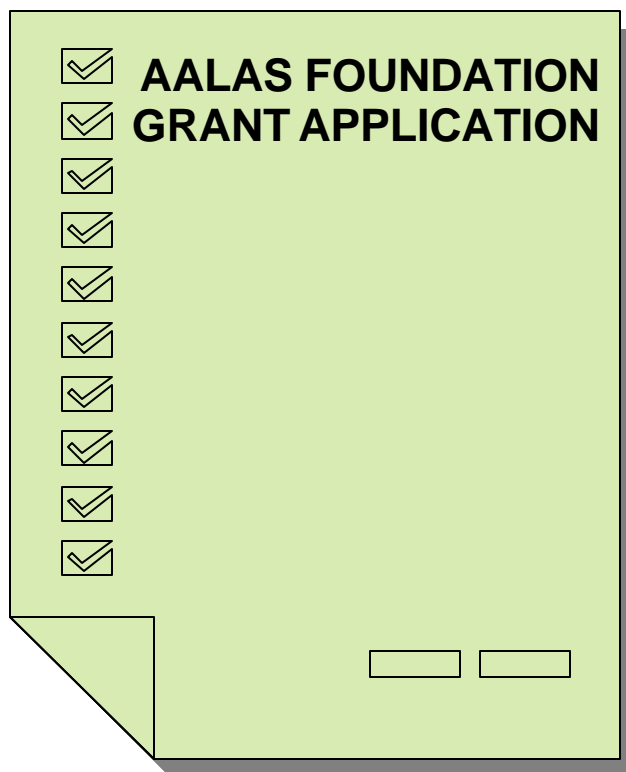
1. Grants will be made to an organization, not a private individual.
2. Grants will be funded on a one-year basis.
3. A one-page midyear and (more comprehensive) final progress report **must** be submitted by the principal contact named on the grant application.
4. Initial funding is distributed at 85%. The remaining 15% will be issued after an acceptable midterm **and** final report have been received.
5. All written materials resulting from projects supported by the AALAS Foundation must acknowledge the Foundation's support and contain the Foundation's website. The AALAS Foundation must have written permission to circulate, as it deems appropriate, the materials developed as a product of grant funding.
6. Grant recipients are encouraged to share with the laboratory animal science community concepts and ideas related to a Foundation grant through posters, presentations or articles for publication.
7. The AALAS Foundation Board may attach additional conditions to an approval, according to the individual characteristics of the grant.

V. CONTINUED AND RENEWAL APPLICATIONS

Continuation or renewal support after the first year of a project is contingent upon receiving midterm and final progress reports of the original funded project, plus submission of a new proposal.

Durbin and Pierson Award Guidelines

NCAB DURBIN AWARD

The technician selected for the Annual NCAB Durbin Award shall be a person whose primary responsibility is the feeding, handling and care of animals.

One or more should be used in selecting the nominee:

1. Daily contact with animals of one or more species in the form of handling, feeding, watering and changing bedding.
2. Demonstrated positive attitude toward the welfare of animals.
3. Demonstrated performance in completing animal care related duties, as well or better than the expected level of performance for the facility.
4. Pursuit of knowledge in the field of animal care should be present.
5. Innovative approaches to animal care problems should be cited.
6. Supervisory responsibility and formal degrees are not important considerations.
7. All other considerations being equal, candidates having current membership in the NCAB/AALAS or National AALAS will be selected.

NCAB PIERSON AWARD

The technician selected for the Annual Pierson Award shall be a person whose duties and responsibilities include daily contact with animals in the conduct of technical or supervisory duties.

One or more should be used in selecting the nominee:

1. Daily contact with laboratory animals of one or more species in the performance of technical duties such as specimen collection, necropsies, surgical manipulations or operating diagnostic equipment.
2. Scope of direct working supervision over personnel responsible for the care and feeding and general welfare of animals.
3. Demonstrated attitude, performance level and innovative approach toward the betterment of animal care.
4. Demonstrated pursuit of knowledge of animal husbandry through academic training, animal care course work or certification in the field of animal husbandry (examples: Bachelor or AA degrees, AALAS Certification, Veterinary Assistance Training).
5. All other considerations being equal candidates having current membership in the NCAB/AALAS or National AALAS will be selected.

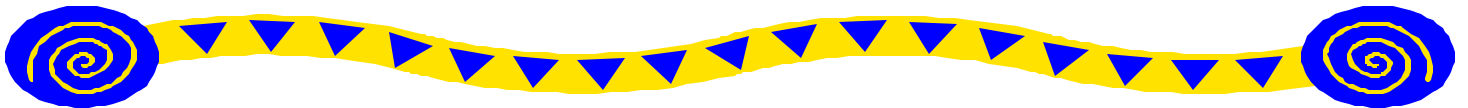
